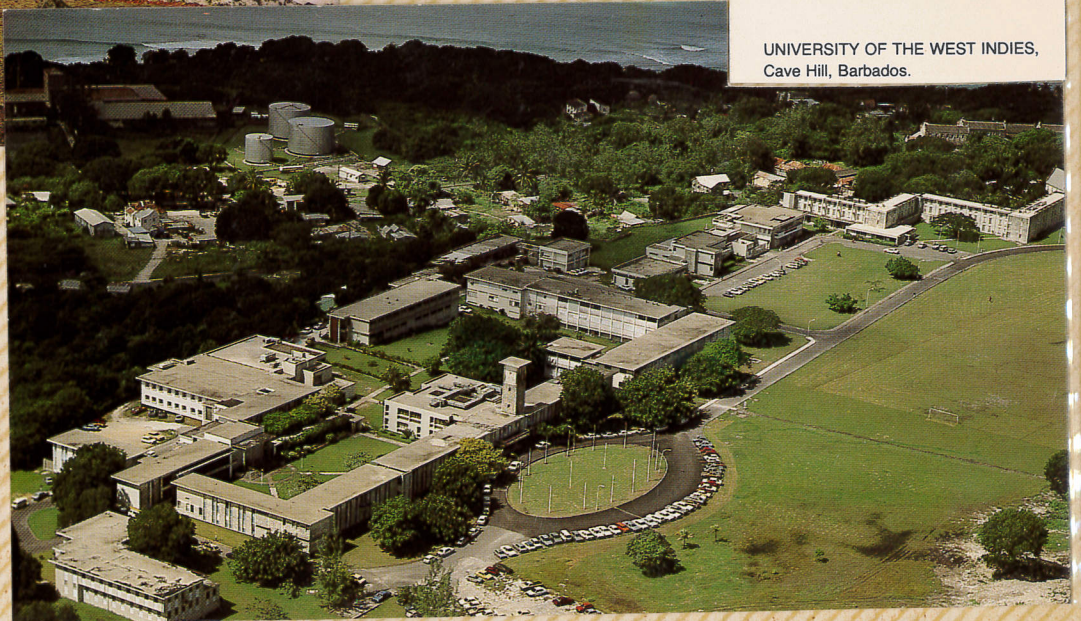

Port City: Bridgetown

Population: about 252,000 in Barbados

Language: English, with a Barbadian dialect also spoken

Climate: From December to June the island enjoys the northeast trade winds and temperatures are in the mid to upper 70's. During the rest of the year, the trade winds diminish and the temperature is usually in the mid 80's

Currency: the Barbados Dollar (\$BD), often referred to as the Bajan Dollar. \$1.00 BD roughly equals \$.50 U.S.

As testimony to Great Britain's rule, a visit to Barbados often creates the impression that this is a smaller, warm-weather England.

A statue of Lord Nelson dominates Trafalgar Square. The Harbor Police still wear 18th century naval midddy blouses, bell-bottomed trousers, and boaters – and are a picturesque sight as they row their

long boats in Bridgetown's harbor.

A colorful spiked-helmet mounted police regiment is found in Barbados, while a precise, quick stepping Royal Police Band is famous throughout the Caribbean and North America for its toe-tapping beats.

The precise, dignified character of the British is found in the Barbadian but it has been tempered with a native warmth and friendliness toward strangers that is not usually considered part of the English character.

The names throughout the islands are typically English – Christ Church and St. George, for example – but the food is not.

While classic English dishes are available, they are supplemented by a native cuisine that abounds in palate-pleasing delicacies such as flying fish and wahoo, kingfish, suckling pig, and pepper pot.

But, after all is said, Barbados is still, essentially, an idyllic tropical paradise.

AIRLINE ENVELOPES

These will be returned to your stateroom this evening, as soon as the individual airlines return them to the ship. They will contain your pre-checked airline ticket and baggage tags and, therefore, it is essential this envelope is readily available at San Juan Airport - please do not pack it away in your heavy luggage.

BAGGAGE - 6.00 pm to 8.00 pm - FRIDAY

With the exception of one small piece containing your last minute requirements, baggage should be placed outside your stateroom between 6.00 pm and 8.00 pm Friday evening. Your remaining piece should be placed outside your stateroom before retiring. This is in order to have baggage ready for discharge on arrival on Saturday and to minimise noise when collecting it at night.

You are strongly advised not to pack any valuables inside your main baggage but to keep them with your hand luggage. Baggage to be hand carried need not be placed outside your stateroom - it should be taken by you from your stateroom after breakfast on Saturday.

LABELLING OF BAGGAGE

On arrival in San Juan baggage will be landed dockside where it can be located under the following colour codes:

There will be no Continental Breakfast service in the Union Jack Bar and no breakfast service to staterooms on Saturday morning.

CUSTOMS INSPECTION

United States Customs Inspection will take place on the dockside, after you have collected your baggage. Guests will be required to produce their Customs Declaration Form, one per family, duly completed.

If you have goods to declare you should approach a Customs Officer to make your declaration.

If you have nothing to declare, pass straight through the Customs Hall, although Customs Officials may have spot checks at random. If you are unsure if you have any goods to declare, you are strongly advised to check with a Customs Official.

AIRLINE REPRESENTATIVES

Representatives of American, Eastern and Delta Airlines will be available on the dockside in San Juan. Here guests travelling on those airlines will be able to check in their baggage after clearing Customs. Your baggage will then be transferred directly to the airport. Porters are readily available from the Customs area to the airline trucks.

Extra luggage labels may be obtained from these representatives on the dock.

DISEMBARKATION

Disembarkation is expected to commence at approximately 9.00 am after all the baggage has been landed into the Customs area. For your own comfort and safety, please remain seated in the lounges until a broadcast is made saying that your group may go ashore.

Disembarkation will be as follows :

- Group One : Those guests booked on flights departing before 1.00 pm Saturday.
 - Group Two : Those guests in PROMENADE or BAJA Deck staterooms with flights departing after 1.00 pm Saturday.
 - Group Three : Those guests in AURORA or CAPRI Deck staterooms with flights departing after 1.00 pm Saturday.
 - Group Four : Those guests staying at the Hotel El Convento or Condado Beach Hotel, Guests on tours A, B and C and those staying independently in San Juan.
- Disembarkation cards may be collected from the INFORMATION DESK at the same time as baggage tags. Group Four do not need a special disembarkation card, but will be called after everyone else has gone ashore.

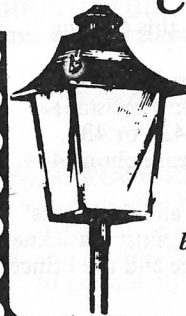

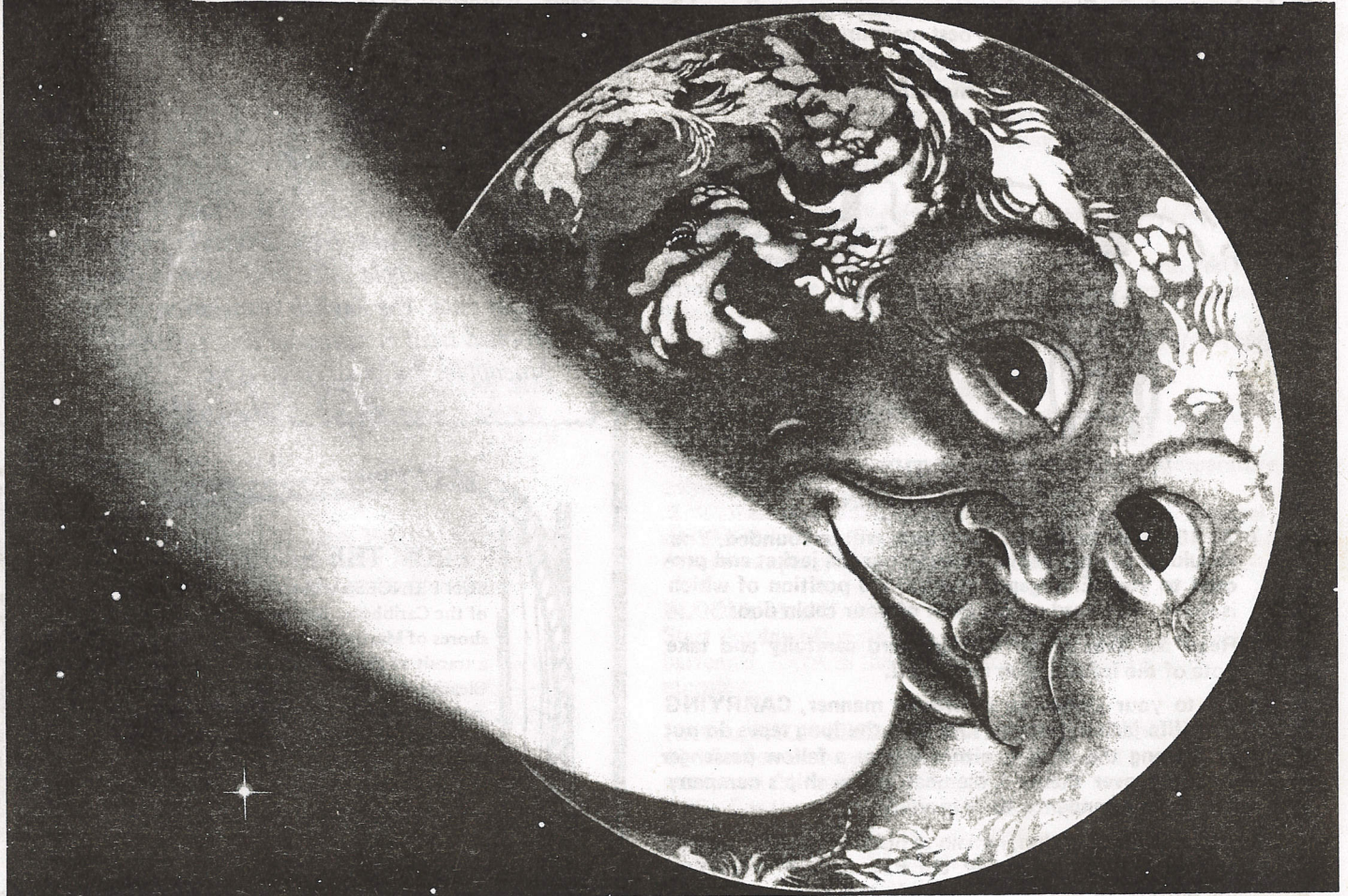

THE RETURN OF COMET HALLEY!!

Halley's Comet has a long history. Records of its existence go back long before the time of Christ and, since the year 83BC, it has been observed at every return.

The Comet's period is 76 years although this may vary by a year or two because of perturbation by the planets. It was named after Edmond Halley, Great Britain's Astronomer Royal who observed it in 1682 and who calculated that it was the same comet which had been observed in 1607 and 1531. He predicted that it would return in 1758, which it duly did, being observed on Christmas night. Unfortunately, Halley did not live to see it on this occasion. Since then, it has returned in 1835 and 1910, when it was quite brilliant. Sadly, this time, it does not appear quite as spectacular because earth's position in orbit around the sun does not coincide with favourable observation of Halley.

The comet is moving at a colossal speed, but because of its immense distance from us, it appears stationary in relation to the stars. Night by night it will slowly traverse the constellations. It attained naked-eye brilliance as it moved into Aquarius at the end of last month but, at present it sets before the end of twilight and is lost as it swings around the opposite side of the sun. In mid-march, Halley reappears from solar glare. However, in the Northern Hemisphere, it will be low in the Southern sky. For the best view, you will have to go to the Southern Hemisphere for its closest approach on April 11th, when it will be some 39 million miles away from earth. This is about 4 minutes at the speed of light or a distance which would take SUN PRINCESS two centuries, at top speed, to cover. The return of the comet on this occasion is exciting because it is the first time that there has been the technology to send space probes to go and have a close look at it. Great Britain is concerned with one mission, GIOTTO, named after the Florentine painter who used the comet as a model for the star of Bethlehem in the painting, "The Adoration of the Magi." From its close approach, Halley recedes into the depths of space, far out beyond the orbit of planet Neptune. Halley returns again in the year 2061. What sort of world will it find then?

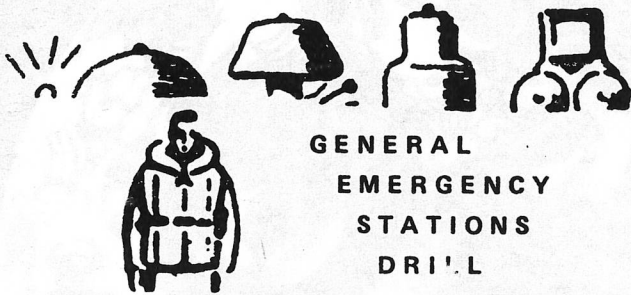

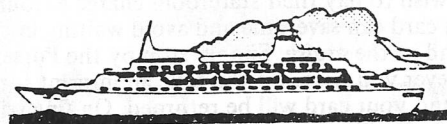

BARBADOS



Many visitors to Barbados never seem to get further than the beach and the shops. They return home not really knowing very much about the island as a whole. Despite its size Barbados does have quite a number of interesting places to visit. Places that reek of history and/or beauty that can easily be discovered by either hiring a car and doing your own exploration, or taking an island tour offered by one or other of the local tour companies.

To assist you we would like to recommend various landmarks, beauty spots and attractions which we think might interest you!

The City of Bridgetown was founded by the settlers sent out by the Earl of Carlisle in 1628. These early settlers found an old wooden Indian bridge - probably located in the vicinity of the Chamberlain Bridge - and the town is referred to in the record as The Bridge or St. Michael's Town.

Trafalgar Square at the top of Broad Street, was so named when the statue of Admiral Lord Nelson by Sir Richard Westmacott was erected there in 1813 just eight years after Nelson met his death at Trafalgar. He had become very popular in Barbados following a visit with his fleet and flagship "Victory" in 1805. It is noteworthy that the statue of Nelson in London's Trafalgar Square was not erected until 1840!

The Public Buildings: The subject of many an artist's brush and photographers camera, these imposing buildings were erected in 1871 following a fire in 1860 which had devastated the area. The East wing contains the Senate Chamber and the House of Assembly and is worth a visit to see the handsome coloured glass windows representing the sovereigns of England from James 1 to Queen Victoria, in whose reign it was erected. Even Cromwell, the Great Protector is there.

St. Michael's Cathedral was consecrated in 1665. Of interest is the beautiful roof, in its

day the widest arched roof in the world, and the tombstones dating back to 1660.

Queen's Park: This was the residence of the General commanding the British Troops in the West Indies. Prior to the succession of Queen Victoria it was known as 'King's House'. On the withdrawal of the British Regiments from the island during the early years of this century, it was taken over by Government, and the control was vested in the then Vestry of St. Michael and turned into a park. It was opened on 10th June 1909. It is now under the administration of the Parks and Beaches Commission who have done much to restore it to its former beauty. In the grounds of the Park there is one of the largest trees in Barbados. This is a 'Boabab' and is 61 1/2 feet in circumference and is estimated to be over one thousand years old. The 'Boabab' is a native of Africa and no one is sure how it came to be in Barbados.

St. Patrick's Cathedral (R.C.), Jemmotts Lane, dates back to 1839 when an Irish regiment stationed here asked for a church.

Government House: This old mansion was rented from the Pilgrim family by the Government of Barbados for the residence of the Governor in 1702. Some years later it was purchased by the Government and has remained the official residence of the Governors of Barbados, and now the Governor-General. Sir Evan Macgregor,

Governor of the island from 1836, claimed that 'Pilgrim', as Government House was known, was not in a fit condition to live in, as it had been damaged by the hurricane of 1831, so he moved to 'Hastings House' where he died in 1841. The Pilgrim family were Quakers and the two wooded triangles which are outside the walls of Government House are the resting places of many members of this family and their Quaker friends. Due to their belief that the last resting place of a member should be known only unto God, there are no memorials erected in this area.

Ilaro Court, Two Mile Hill is the official residence of the Prime Minister of Barbados. Built around 1919, this gracious and unusual house was designed and planned by Lady Gilbert Carter as a home for Sir Gilbert-Carter and herself after his retirement from the Colonial Service. Sir Gilbert-Carter had been Governor of Barbados from 1904-11. After her death in 1953 the house changed hands and became somewhat neglected. The present Government acquired the house and renovations over the last year have restored the residence and grounds to much of their former beauty and elegance.

NEWS AT SEA

MV SUN PRINCESS

24TH FEBRUARY 1986

MANILA, PHILIPPINES - AN EMBATTLED PRESIDENT FERDINAND E. MARCOS DECLARED A STATE OF EMERGENCY MONDAY TO QUELL A REVOLT BY TWO TOP MILITARY LEADERS AND WENT ON NATIONWIDE TELEVISION TO SCOFF AT REPORTS HE WAS PREPARING TO FLEE THE COUNTRY.

MARCOS DECLARED, 'I INTEND TO STAY ON AS PRESIDENT.' BUT THE GOVERNMENT TELEVISION STATION CHANNEL 4 WENT OFF THE AIR ABRUPTLY, CUTTING OFF THE MARCOS STATEMENT IN THE MIDDLE OF A SENTENCE.

THE REBELLION WAS LED BY FORMER DEFENSE MINISTER JUAN PONCE ENRILE AND LT. GEN. FIDEL V. RAMOS, DEPUTY CHIEF OF THE ARMED FORCES, WHO ANNOUNCED SATURDAY THEY HAD BROKEN WITH MARCOS AND DEMANDED HIS RESIGNATION. THEY SAID MARCOS HAD CHEATED CORAZON AQUINO OUT OF VICTORY IN THE FEB. 7 PRESIDENTIAL ELECTION AND THAT SHE SHOULD BE ALLOWED TO TAKE OVER AS PRESIDENT.

WASHINGTON - PRESIDENT REAGAN, IN HIS STRONGEST MESSAGE YET TO EMBATTLED PHILIPPINE PRESIDENT FERDINAND MARCOS, THREATENED TO CUT OFF U.S. MILITARY AID IF HE USES FORCE AGAINST HIS OPPONENTS.

'WE CANNOT CONTINUE OUR EXISTING MILITARY ASSISTANCE IF THE GOVERNMENT USES THAT AID AGAINST OTHER ELEMENTS OF THE PHILIPPINE MILITARY THAT ENJOY POPULAR BACKING,' WHITE HOUSE SPOKESMAN LARRY SPEAKES SAID IN A STATEMENT ISSUED AFTER REAGAN MET WITH HIS TOP FOREIGN POLICY ADVISERS.

NICOSIA, CYPRUS - IRAN AND IRAQ BOTH CLAIMED BATTLEFRONT SUCCESSES SUNDAY IN THE 2-WEEK-OLD FIGHT FOR CONTROL OF THE FAW PENINSULA IN SOUTHERN IRAQ.

THE CLAIMS AND COUNTER-CLAIMS CAME AS SAUDI ARABIA AND ALGERIA LAUNCHED MEDIATION EFFORTS, WHILE IRAN EMPHASIZED THERE WOULD BE NO END TO THE WAR BEFORE THE OVERTHROW OF IRAQI PRESIDENT SADDAM HUSSEIN.

TEL AVIV, ISRAEL - A CABINET SOURCE SAID SUNDAY THE GOVERNMENT IS HAVING DOUBTS ABOUT HOW USEFUL ITS SO-CALLED SECURITY ZONE IN SOUTHERN LEBANON IS AFTER A VAIN SEARCH FOR TWO CAPTURED SOLDIERS AND A WEEK OF ROCKET ATTACKS INTO ISRAEL.

MORE THAN A DOZEN SOVIET-MADE KATYUSHA ROCKET SHELLS FELL ON NORTHERN ISRAEL DURING THE PAST THREE DAYS, HALF THE TOTAL FOR THE PREVIOUS SIX MONTHS.

WASHINGTON - IN A FORMAL REPLY TO SOVIET LEADER MIKHAIL GORBACHEV'S ARMS CONTROL PROPOSAL, PRESIDENT REAGAN HAS DRAFTED A SWEEPING PLAN URGING ELIMINATION OF MEDIUM RANGE MISSILES IN EUROPE AS A FIRST STEP, A U.S. OFFICIAL SAYS.

AMMAN, JORDAN - ALMOST 2,000 PEOPLE GATHERED AT A PALACE PARADE GROUNDS ON SUNDAY AS PART OF A SERIES OF PUBLIC RALLIES SUPPORTING KING HUSSEIN'S DECISION TO END HIS ALLIANCE WITH PALESTINE LIBERATION ORGANIZATION LEADERS.

KOROR, PALAU - PALAUANS HAVE OVERWHELMINGLY ENDORSED A NEW POLITICAL RELATIONSHIP WITH THE UNITED STATES WHICH COULD BRING THE WESTERN PACIFIC ISLAND NATION SELF-GOVERNMENT AND A LARGE AMOUNT OF ECONOMIC AID.

LINDA, CALIF. - FLOODWATERS FROM NINE DAYS OF NEARLY RELENTLESS STORMS CONTINUED TO RECEDE SUNDAY IN RAVAGED NORTHERN CALIFORNIA COMMUNITIES, BUT THOUSANDS OF PEOPLE WERE STILL UNABLE TO RETURN HOME.

WASHINGTON - MUCH OF THE DEBATE IN CONGRESS THIS WEEK WILL FOCUS ON PRESIDENT REAGAN'S AMBITIOUS PLANS FOR MILITARY SPENDING AND HIS EXPECTED REQUEST FOR DLRS 100 MILLION IN AID TO NICARAGUAN REBELS.

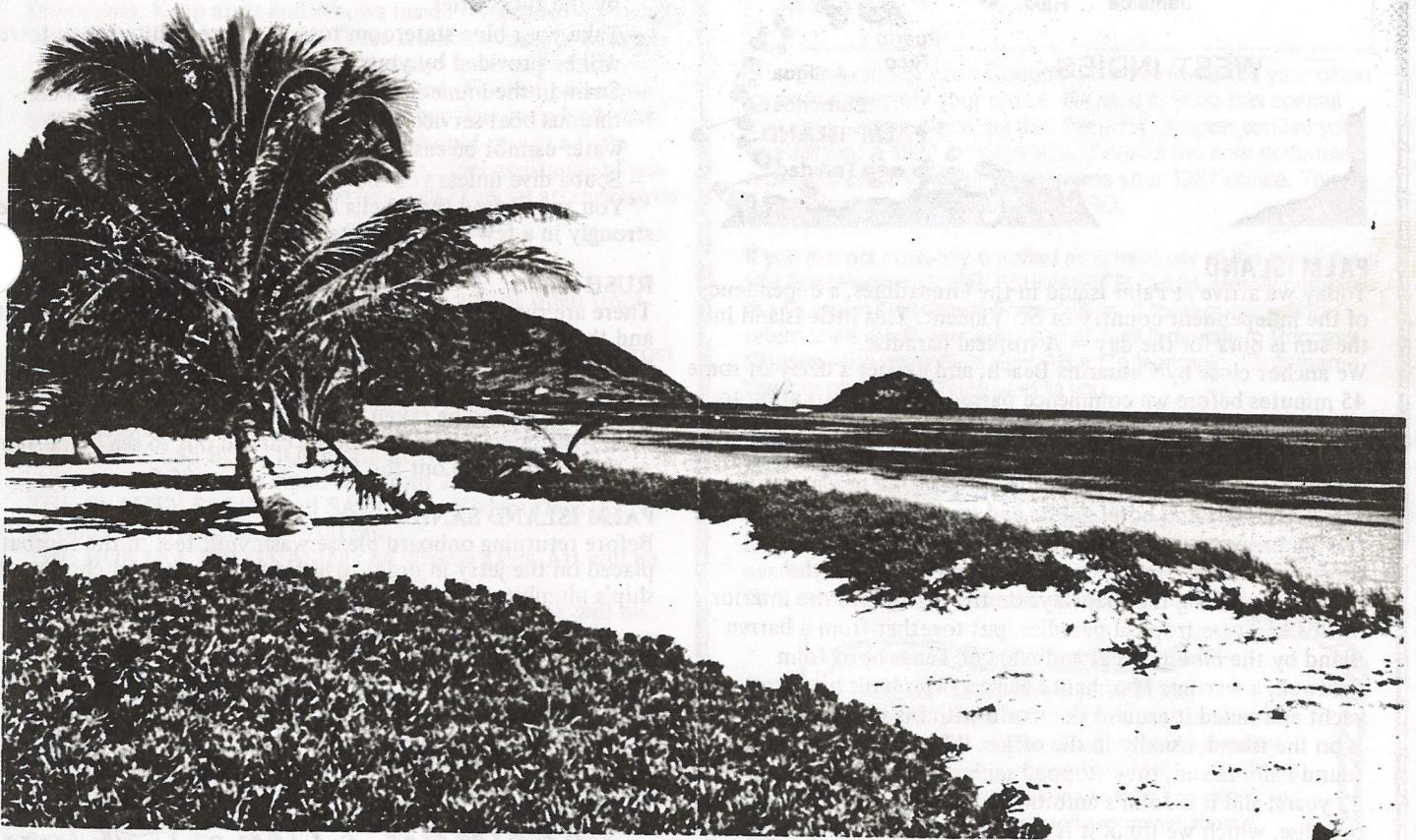

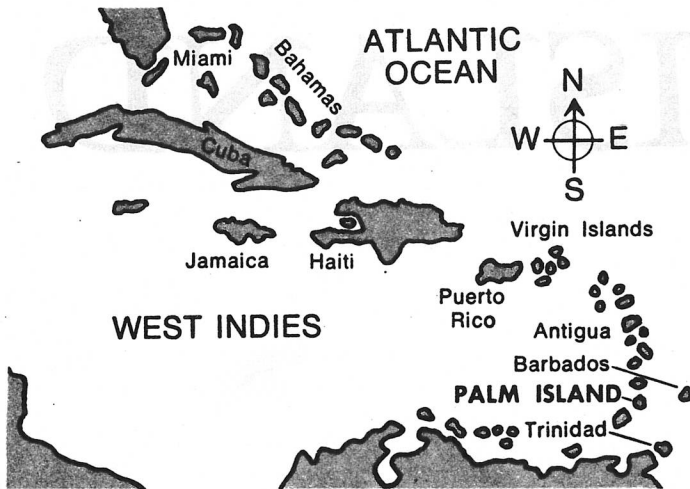

NEWS AT SEA

M.V. SUN PRINCESS

TUESDAY 25TH JANUARY 1986

MANILA, PHILIPPINES - CORAZON AQUINO TOOK THE OATH OF OFFICE TUESDAY AS PRESIDENT OF A PROVISIONAL GOVERNMENT DECLARED BY MILITARY REBELS BATTLING TO END THE 20-YEAR RULE OF FERDINAND E. MARCOS, WHO HIMSELF WAS SWORN IN LATER IN HIS GUARDED PALACE.

MARCOS, 68, SAID MONDAY HIS FAMILY WAS 'COWERING' IN TERROR INSIDE THE MALACANANG PALACE, SURROUNDED BY STILL-LOYAL TROOPS TAUNTED BY A JEERING PRO-AQUINO CROWD. THE UNITED STATES AND OTHER WESTERN GOVERNMENTS SAY HIS ELECTION VICTORY OVER MRS. AQUINO WAS ACHIEVED BY FRAUD AND HE SHOULD STEP DOWN.

TEN PEOPLE WERE REPORTED WOUNDED WHEN SOLDIERS FIRED AT CROWDS OF AQUINO SUPPORTERS OUTSIDE THE PALACE AND IN A CLASH AT THE MAIN GOVERNMENT TELEVISION STATION, WHICH REBELS TOOK OVER IN THE MIDDLE OF A MARCOS BROADCAST.

WASHINGTON - PRESIDENT REAGAN, IN A DRAMATIC REVERSAL, URGED PHILIPPINE PRESIDENT FERDINAND E. MARCOS TO SURRENDER POWER MONDAY AND TOLD HIM IT WOULD BE 'FUTILE' TO TRY TO PROLONG HIS 20-YEAR RULE THROUGH VIOLENCE.

WHILE CALLING MARCOS 'AN OLD FRIEND AND ALLY,' THE ADMINISTRATION ALL BUT OFFERED A U.S. PLANE TO WHISK HIM TO SAFE HAVEN IN THE UNITED STATES.

BEIRUT, LEBANON - A CAR PACKED WITH MORTARS, MINES AND AN ESTIMATED 45 POUNDS OF TNT EXPLODED NEAR A SUPERMARKET IN CHRISTIAN EAST BEIRUT MONDAY, KILLING AT LEAST FIVE PEOPLE AND INJURING 12 OTHERS, POLICE SAID.

TEL AVIV, ISRAEL - THE JUSTICE MINISTRY SAID MONDAY THAT A MAN ACCUSED OF HELPING KILL NEARLY A MILLION JEWS IN A NAZI CONCENTRATION CAMP PROBABLY WOULD BE EXTRADITED FROM AMERICA WITHIN 24 HOURS TO BE TRIED FOR HIS LIFE.

SPOKESMAN YITZHAK FEINBERG TOLD THE ASSOCIATED PRESS THAT 'BARRING BAD WEATHER' JOHN DEMJANJUK, A 65-YEAR-OLD RETIRED CLEVELAND AUTOWORKER, WAS EXPECTED TO ARRIVE HERE TUESDAY.

WASHINGTON - THE SUPREME COURT MONDAY AGREED TO DECIDE BY JULY THE CONSTITUTIONALITY OF THE NEW LAW THAT REQUIRES A BALANCED FEDERAL BUDGET BY 1991.

THE COURT, SETTING THE STAGE FOR A MAJOR DECISION ON GOVERNMENTAL POWERS AND FEDERAL SPENDING, SAID IT WILL REVIEW A RULING THAT STRUCK DOWN A CENTRAL PROVISION OF THE GRAMM-RUDMAN ACT.

WASHINGTON - A MUCH-PUBLICIZED ORDINANCE THAT WOULD MAKE DISTRIBUTORS OF PORNOGRAPHY SUBJECT TO SEX DISCRIMINATION LAWSUITS IS UNCONSTITUTIONAL, THE SUPREME COURT RULED MONDAY.

THE COURT, BY A 6-3 VOTE, SAID THE INDIANAPOLIS ORDINANCE IMPERMISSIBLY INTERFERES WITH FREE SPEECH.

CAPE CANAVERAL, FLA. - FORMER ASTRONAUT RICHARD H. TRULY, THE NEW HEAD OF NASA'S SPACE SHUTTLE PROGRAM, SAID MONDAY THERE ARE 'A LOT OF OPTIONS THAT HAVE TO BE STUDIED' BEFORE HE CAN MAKE A RECOMMENDATION ON WHEN THE SHUTTLE SHOULD FLY AGAIN.

NEW YORK - GERBER PRODUCTS CO. ON MONDAY SUED MARYLAND GOV. HARRY HUGHES AND OTHER STATE OFFICIALS FOR DLRS 150 MILLION AFTER THE STATE BANNED SALES OF A BABY-FOOD PRODUCT SUSPECTED OF CONTAINING FRAGMENTS OF GLASS.

'GERBER STRONGLY BELIEVES THAT THE UNILATERAL CONDUCT OF THE GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MARYLAND HAS ONLY CREATED A CLIMATE OF FEAR AND CONFUSION AMONG THE CONSUMING PUBLIC AT A TIME WHEN COPYCAT ACTIONS SHOULD NOT BE ENCOURAGED BY ACTS OF PUBLIC OFFICIALS,' GERBER SAID FROM ITS FREMONT, MICH., HEADQUARTERS.

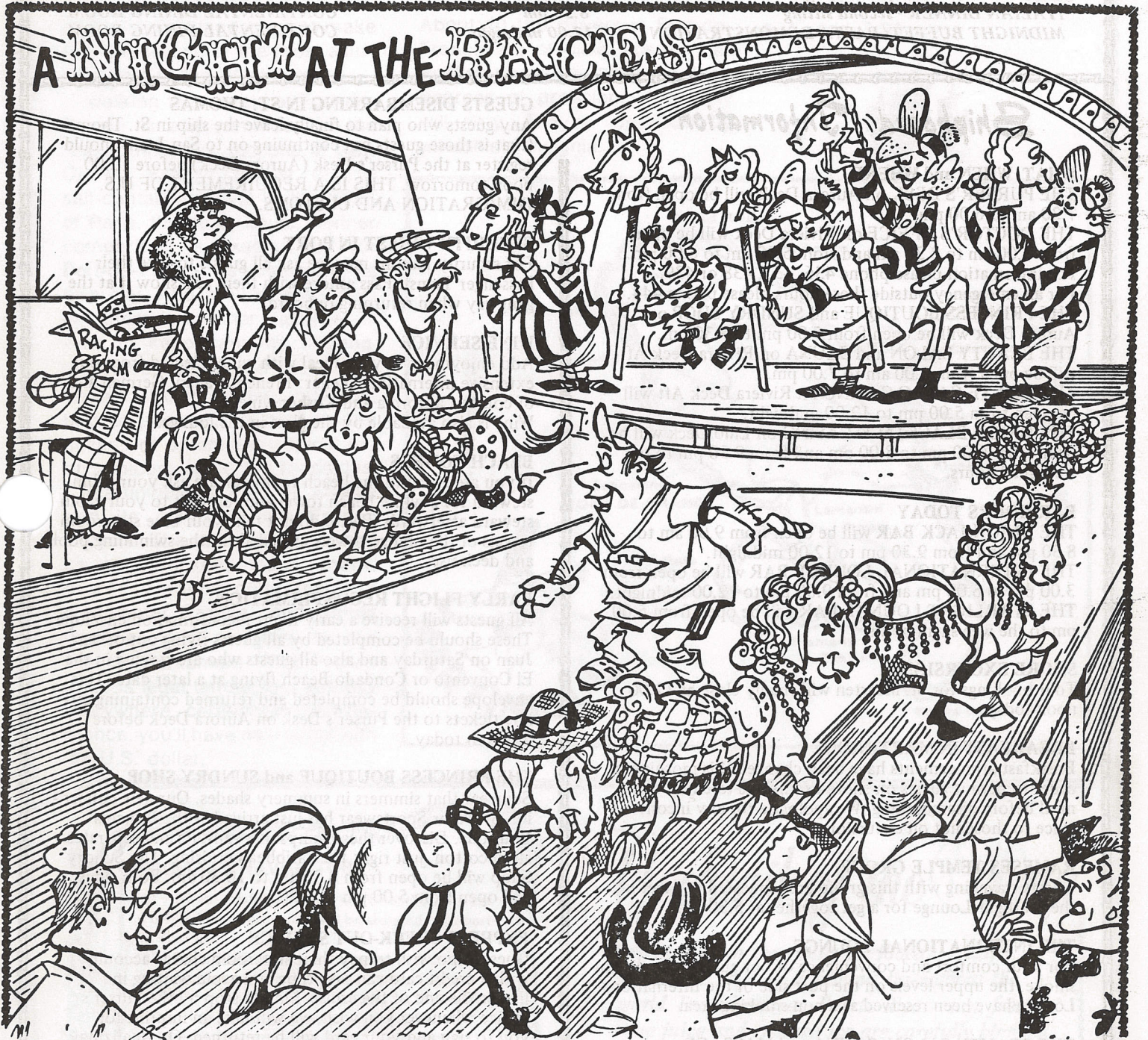

Welcome to Martinique

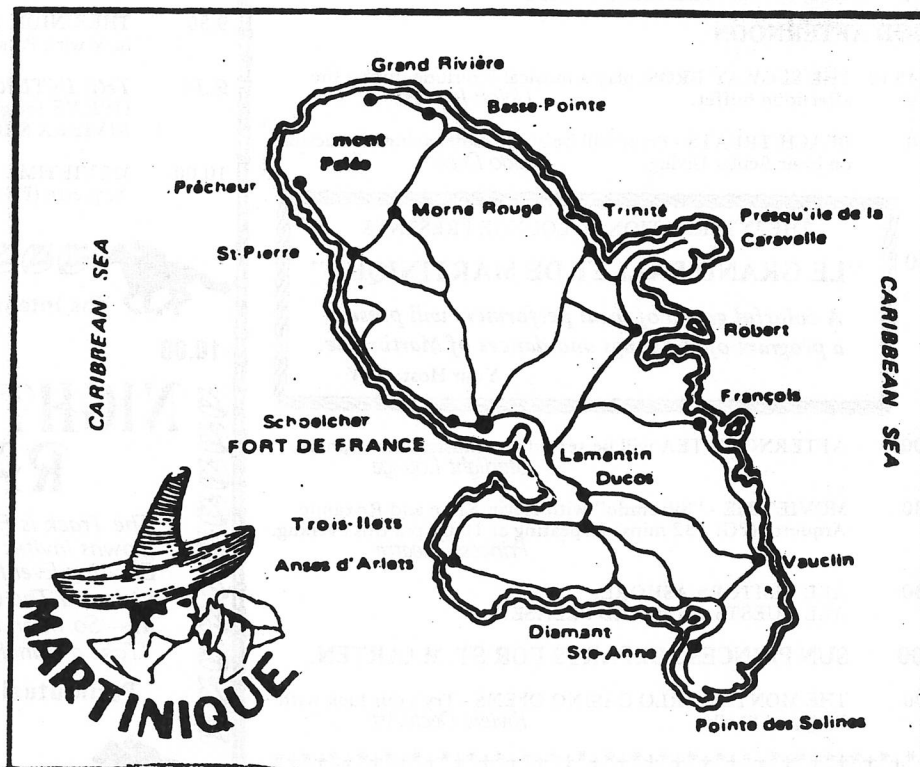
The French influence is all-pervasive in this lush corner of the Caribbean. Overlays of French culture and Creole architecture mingle with the islanders' verve, their vitality, and the sheer beauty of the tropical landscape to make Martinique one of the most alluring spots in the West Indies.

Walking the streets of Fort-de-France, one is reminded of the less-commercial sections of New Orleans' French Quarter, or that self-contained jewel in the heart of Paris, the Ile S. Louis. Neither comparison is exactly fair, for Fort-de-France is definitely its own city. And around every corner there is another picturesque vista to keep cameras clicking. Martinique calls itself the isle of flowers. Bougainvillea, hibiscus, bird of paradise, anthurium and dozens of unfamiliar tropical exotica bloom along the roadsides.

Martinique is part of France and its residents are French citizens. The island is governed as an Overseas Department, exactly as are the departments of continental France, and sends deputies and senators to the French Parliament. The French franc is legal tender, but virtually everywhere, certainly in Fort-de-France, you'll have no trouble with the U.S. dollar.

A good phrase book or pocket dictionary should help you get through a menu, though the more tourist-oriented places usually have either an English menu or English-speaking staff member. About 40 taxi drivers in Fort-de-France are officially licensed as English-speaking, although their degrees of proficiency naturally will vary. They're identified by windshield insignia.

Shopping hours in Martinique are normally from 8:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. and from 2:30 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. but when there are cruise ships in the harbour most stores stay open between 12:30 p.m. and 2:30 p.m.

AGANA, GUAM - DEPOSED PHILIPPINE PRESIDENT FERDINAND E. MARCOS, EN ROUTE TO EXILE FROM HIS HOMELAND, ARRIVED ON U.S. SOIL WEDNESDAY MORNING AT ANDERSEN AIR FORCE BASE, ABOUT 20 MILES NORTH OF HERE.

THE C-9 MILITARY TRANSPORT JET WAS CARRYING MARCOS, HIS WIFE IMELDA, ALONG WITH GEN. FABIAN VER, A CLOSE ASSOCIATE AND FORMER CHIEF OF FILIPINO MILITARY FORCES, AND VER'S WIFE. 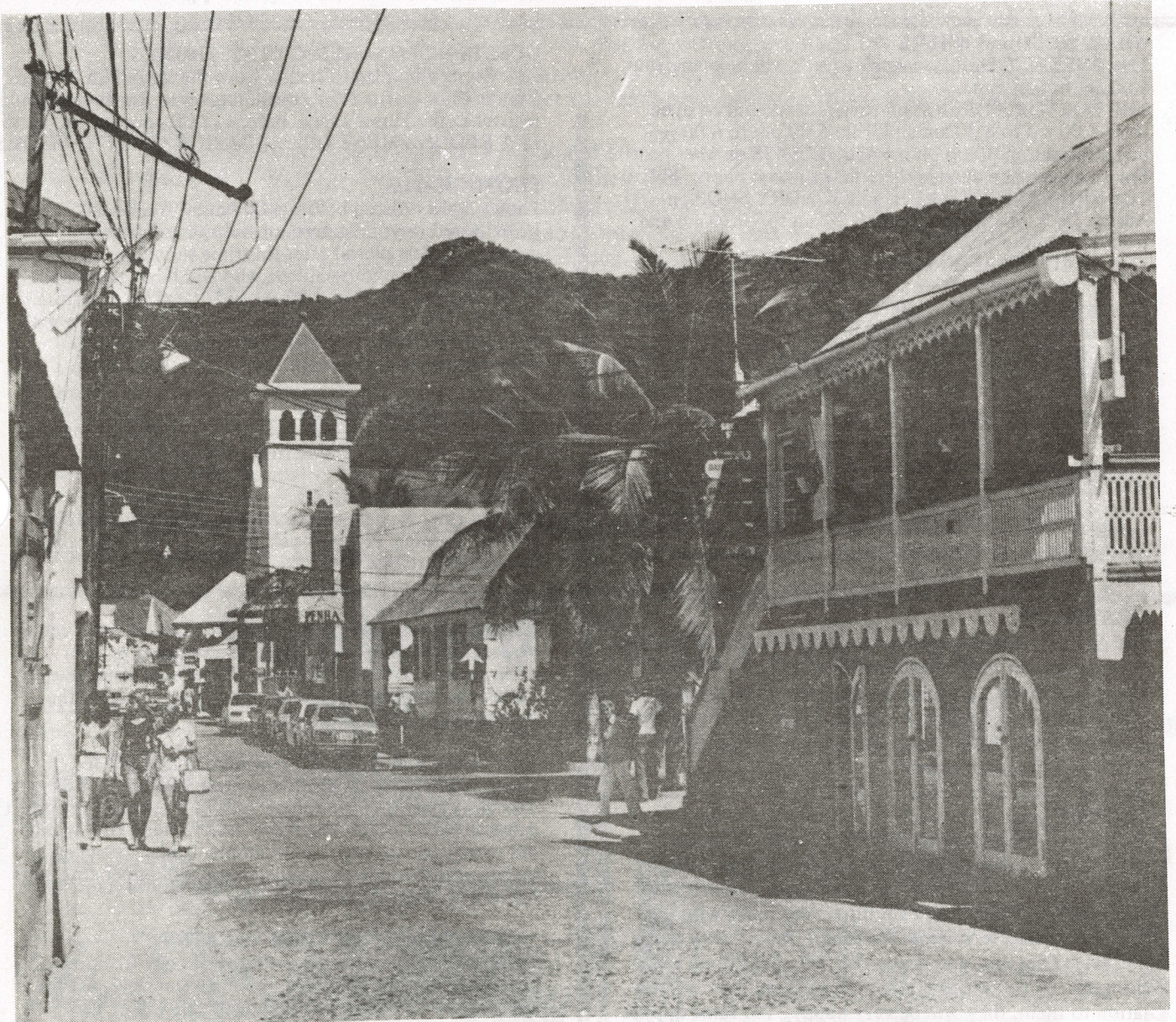

PRINCESS CRUISES 

ST. MARTIN/SINT MAARTEN

St. Martin / Sint Maarten, which measures just 37 square miles is an international pleasure island that is half Dutch and half French - the smallest territory in the world to be shared by two sovereign states. In addition to its dozens of beaches, it offers the "Dutch touch," which sparkles in town and at the gambling casinos, and the French flair, which dominates the cuisine even at the tiniest bistro.

HISTORY

Columbus supposedly discovered the island on St. Martin's Day in 1493. He called it San Martin and sailed on to other islands, having had a taste of Carib reception committees elsewhere. The French and Dutch began small settlements from 1631 to 1633, and French pirates made their mark on the island community in 1638. The Spanish dropped by briefly in 1640, the same year that the Dutch were digging into permanent settlements on San Martin under the leadership of Peter Stuyvesant, who lost his leg during the skirmish.

In 1648, according to local legend, French and Dutch prisoners of war, brought to the island to destroy the Spanish fort and buildings, came from their hiding places after the Spainards had been routed from the island and realized that they had an island to share. They agreed to divide the island by peaceable means and registered their plan with the Dutch colony that was then in authority on nearby Statia and with the French government of Guadeloupe. The oft-told story goes that the frontier was defined by a walking contest. A Frenchman and a Dutchman, starting at the same spot, walked around the island in opposite directions. It was agreed that the boundary line would be drawn straight across the island where they met. The Frenchman walked faster, but the Dutch portion, though smaller, turned out to be more valuable, thanks to the important salt ponds. Local legend has it that the Frenchman's stroll was supplemented with portions of wine and that the Dutchman was slowed because of his own Dutch gin. No matter what the reasons were for the division in 1648, the islanders unveiled a ceremonial plaque at the border, commemorating 300 years of harmonious coexistence. There are no barriers, no customs inspectors, no formalities - simply a hand painted sign, "Bienvenue Partie Francaise"; as you head into the French portion on either of the two roads that thread the border crossing. No-where else in the world do two countries maintain their entirely different local customs (and holidays) on an area as small as this one.

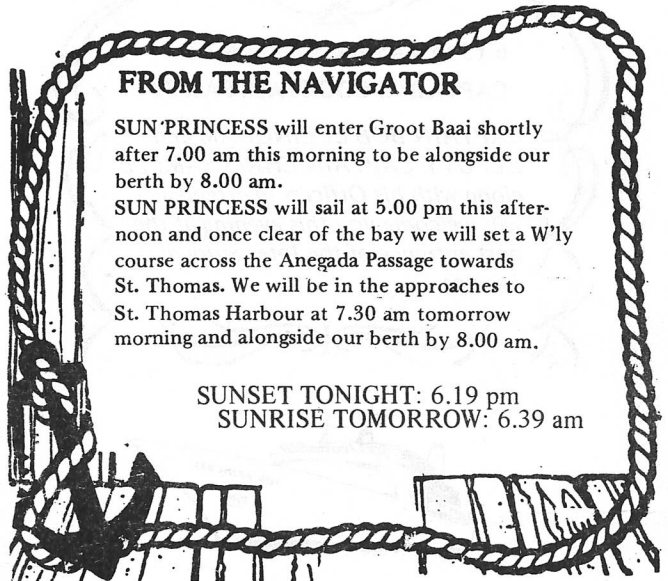

NEWS

HONOLULU - EXILED FORMER PHILIPPINE PRESIDENT FERDINAND MARCOS ARRIVED IN HAWAII WEDNESDAY TO TAKE UP AT LEAST TEMPORARY RESIDENCE IN A PLACE HE AND HIS FAMILY VISITED FREQUENTLY DURING HIS 20 YEARS IN POWER.

THE U.S. AIR FORCE C-141 TRANSPORT CARRYING MARCOS AND HIS FAMILY LANDED AT HICKAM AIR FORCE BASE AT 10:42 A.M., HST (3:42 P.M. EST).

THE PLANE CARRIED THE PARTY OF 89 INCLUDING HIS WIFE, IMELDA, THREE CHILDREN AND THREE GRANDCHILDREN FROM ANDERSEN AIR BASE IN GUAM EARLIER IN THE DAY, SAID CAPT. GARY STRASBOURG, DEPUTY BASE PUBLIC AFFAIRS OFFICE AT ANDERSEN. MARCOS STAYED AT THE BASE FOR 13 HOURS AFTER FLEEING HIS HOMELAND.

WASHINGTON - ENCOURAGED BY CORAZON AQUINO'S ACTIONS DURING HER FIRST 24 HOURS AS PRESIDENT OF THE PHILIPPINES, CONGRESSIONAL AND ADMINISTRATION OFFICIALS WEDNESDAY PREDICTED INCREASED AMERICAN AID TO HELP HER SHORE UP THE SAGGING ECONOMY AND FIGHT A COMMUNIST-BACKED INSURGENCY.

MRS. AQUINO FACES ENORMOUS PROBLEMS, BUT SHE APPEARS TO HAVE TAKEN OFFICE TUESDAY WITH LESS TURMOIL AND VIOLENCE THAN THE ADMINISTRATION THOUGHT POSSIBLE.

ADMINISTRATION OFFICIALS LIKED MRS. AQUINO'S EARLY APPOINTMENTS AND HER QUICK MOVE TO CONSOLIDATE HER AUTHORITY. WHITE HOUSE SPOKESMAN LARRY SPEAKES SAID, 'SO FAR SHE'S DONE A GOOD JOB.'

WASHINGTON - PRESIDENT REAGAN DECLARED WEDNESDAY THAT IT WOULD BE 'RECKLESS, DANGEROUS AND WRONG' FOR CONGRESS TO REDUCE HIS DLRS 320 BILLION MILITARY BUDGET REQUEST, SAYING CUTS 'COULD FATALLY COMPROMISE OUR NEGOTIATING POSITION' WITH THE SOVIETS.

MILITARY SPENDING CUTS WOULD BE 'BACKSLIDING OF THE MOST IRRESPONSIBLE KIND,' HE SAID IN A NATIONALLY BROADCAST SPEECH. DEMOCRATS, IN REACTION, WERE CRITICAL AND EVEN REPUBLICANS SAID THE BUDGET WAS SURE TO BE REDUCED.

WASHINGTON - PRESIDENT REAGAN'S PROPOSED BUDGET FOR THE NEW YEAR FALLS DLRS 15.7 BILLION SHORT OF A DLRS 144 BILLION DEFICIT TARGET, AND OVER THE NEXT FIVE YEARS WOULD PRODUCE DLRS 151 BILLION MORE IN RED INK THAN THE ADMINISTRATION ESTIMATES, CONGRESSIONAL ECONOMISTS REPORTED WEDNESDAY.

WASHINGTON - A KEY SPACE AGENCY OFFICIAL SAID WEDNESDAY HE WOULD HAVE ASKED MORE QUESTIONS JUST HOURS BEFORE LIFTOFF HAD HE KNOWN A GROUP OF CORPORATE ENGINEERS STILL FEARED SUB-FREEZING TEMPERATURES POSED A THREAT TO THE SHUTTLE CHALLENGER AND ITS CREW.

LAWRENCE MULLOY, WHO SUPERVISES BOOSTER ROCKETS FOR NASA, DISPUTED THAT HE PRESSURED THE ENGINEERS FROM MORTON THIOKOL, INC., TO DROP THE OBJECTIONS THEY DID EXPRESS TO HIM OR THAT HE HAD REVERSED NASA'S LONG EMPHASIS ON SAFETY.

WASHINGTON - EIGHTEEN SENATORS MADE A BIPARTISAN APPEAL TO PRESIDENT REAGAN ON WEDNESDAY TO WITHDRAW HIS REQUEST FOR DLRS 100 MILLION TO HELP REBELS FIGHTING THE LEFTIST NICARAGUAN GOVERNMENT.

AT THE SAME TIME, A GROUP OF REPUBLICAN LEGISLATORS TOLD REAGAN HE FACES A TOUGH BATTLE IN WINNING CAPITOL HILL APPROVAL.

NEW YORK - THE FBI SAID WEDNESDAY IT HAS FOUND 'PREVIOUSLY UNDETECTED SIGNS OF TAMPERING' IN TWO BOTTLES OF EXTRA-STRENGTH TYLENOL CAPSULES THAT WERE LACED WITH CYANIDE, AND SAID THE POISONING OCCURRED 'INDEPENDENT OF THE MANUFACTURING PROCESS.'

THE FBI INVESTIGATION WIDENED WITH THE ANNOUNCEMENT WEDNESDAY THAT A MAN WAS FOUND DEAD IN NASHVILLE, TENN., OF CYANIDE POISONING AND THAT A BOTTLE OF EXTRA-STRENGTH TYLENOL CAPSULES WAS FOUND NEAR HIS BODY.

WASHINGTON - A MILITARY JURY ON WEDNESDAY CONVICTED NAVY SURGEON DONAL M. BILLIG ON TWO COUNTS OF INVOLUNTARY MANSLAUGHTER AND ONE COUNT OF NEGLIGENT HOMICIDE IN THE DEATHS OF PATIENTS IN OPEN HEART OPERATIONS AT BETHESDA NAVAL HOSPITAL.

BILLIG, FORMER CHIEF OF HEART SURGERY AT BETHESDA, CONSIDERED THE NAVY'S PREMIER HOSPITAL, WAS FOUND INNOCENT OF TWO CHARGES OF INVOLUNTARY MANSLAUGHTER IN THE DEATHS OF TWO OTHER PATIENTS.

ST. CROIX

St. Thomas is just one of around 100 islands that make up the Virgin Islands. About half are British and half American. Of the 50 U.S. Virgins there are only three of any significant size: St. Croix, St. Thomas and St. John. St. Croix is the largest in both size (84 square miles against 28 for St. Thomas and 20 for St. John) and population (just under 60,000 against 40,000 in St. Thomas and only 2,000 in St. John).

Much of the history of St. Thomas is linked with that of St. Croix and St. John. In 1733 the French sold the Virgin Islands to the Danish West India and Guinea Company which developed the islands at a tremendous pace with sugar the base of prosperity for St. John and St. Croix and business and trade the base for St. Thomas.

Charlotte Amalie soon became one of the richest ports and busiest commercial centers in the Caribbean. Traders from all over the world could be seen every day in the streets and warehouses which are now patronized in even greater numbers by American tourists.

After the Napoleonic Wars, though, sugar prices fell and world trade shifted eastwards. The Virgin Islands declined in wealth and importance till 1917 when the Danes sold them to the U.S. for 25 million dollars. The original idea was to enable the U.S. to establish a naval base in the Caribbean to deal with the German threat but after the war other bases such as Cuba became more important strategically. To bolster the islands' economies, they were granted virtual free-port facilities and a higher duty free quota than anywhere else in the world along with Guam another small Pacific island. The result has been that the Virgin Islands and St. Thomas in particular have re-emerged as a unique shopping center. Last year alone, well over 250 million dollars was spent by tourists in the Virgin Islands.

Everybody knows St. Thomas for its reputation as the duty free capital of the world and the place where Americans can take \$400 of duty free merchandise home to the States with them including a gallon of liquor.

From the dock, it's a good twenty minutes walk into town and at this early stage of the day, a taxi is to be recommended.

Off the Main Street there are dozens of little side streets and shopping malls such as Palm Passage, Royal Dane Mall and Drake's Passage to be explored, all with shops offering you what must be the most complete range of merchandise to be found in such a small town in the whole world. You'll also find a liberal smattering of restaurants and bars where you can get lunch or just have a drink.

The town of Charlotte Amalie is steeped in history and amongst the places you should not miss are Bluebeard's Castle, Crown House, Government House, Fort Christian, the Frederick Lutheran Church, the Legislative Building and the Grand Hotel Building, recently revamped and now with a restaurant on the second floor.

MANILA, PHILIPPINES - PRESIDENT CORAZON AQUINO'S CABINET OFFICERS TOOK OVER THEIR POSTS THURSDAY AND SHE ORDERED ALL DEPARTMENTS TO CHECK THEIR RECORDS BECAUSE OF REPORTS THAT SOME DOCUMENTS HAD BEEN DESTROYED BY SUPPORTERS OF THE DEPOSED FERDINAND E. MARCOS.

THE NEW GOVERNMENT SAID HUNDREDS OF POLITICAL PRISONERS HELD BY THE FALLEN MARCOS REGIME PROBABLY WOULD BE FREED NEXT WEEK. THIRTY-NINE PRISONERS WERE ORDERED SET FREE THURSDAY.

NEW YORK - PHILIPPINES PRESIDENT CORAZON AQUINO APPEALED TO HER PREDECESSOR FERDINAND MARCOS THURSDAY TO TELL HIS LOYALISTS STILL IN THE COUNTRY NOT TO CAUSE ANY VIOLENCE AGAINST THE NEW REGIME.

ST. THOMAS

St. Thomas is just one of around 100 islands that make up the Virgin Islands. About half are British and half American. Of the 50 U.S. Virgins there are only three of any significant size: St. Croix, St. Thomas and St. John. St. Croix is the largest in both size (84 square miles) and population (just under 60,000 against 30,000 in St. Thomas and only 2,000 in St. John).

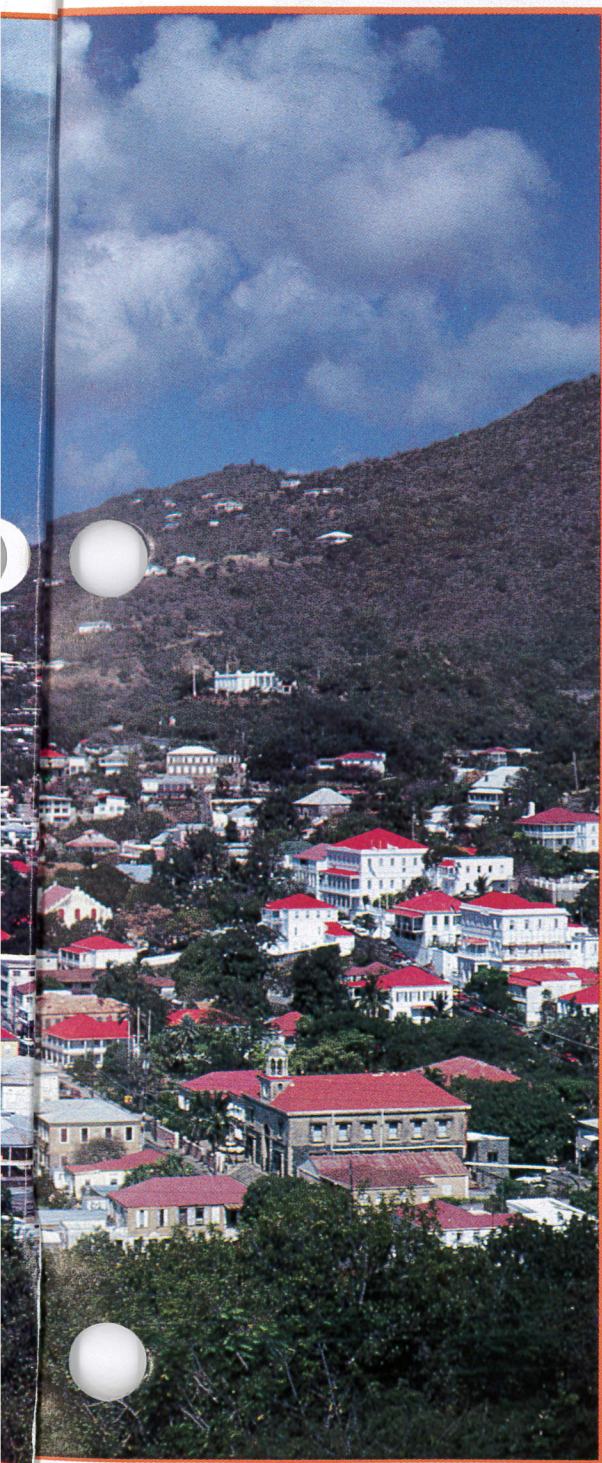
Much of the history of St. Thomas is linked with that of St. Croix and St. John. In 1733 the French sold the Virgin Islands to the Danish West India and Guinea Company which developed the islands at a tremendous pace with sugar the base of prosperity for St. John and St. Croix and business and trade the base of St. Thomas.

Charlotte Amalie soon became one of the richest ports and busiest commercial centers in the Caribbean. Traders from all over the world could be seen every day in the streets and warehouses which are now patronized in even greater numbers by American tourists.

After the Napoleonic Wars, though, sugar prices fell and world trade shifted eastwards.

The Virgin Islands declined in wealth and importance until 1917 when the Danes sold them to the U.S. for 25 million dollars. The original idea was to enable the U.S. to establish a naval base in the Caribbean to deal with the German threat but after the war other bases such as Cuba became more important strategically. To bolster the islands' economies, they were granted virtual freeport facilities and a higher duty-free quota than anywhere else in the world along with Guam and another small Pacific island. The result has been that the Virgin Islands and St. Thomas have re-emerged as a unique shopping cen-





ter. Last year alone, well over 225 million dollars was spent by tourists in the Virgin Islands.

Of this sum, over 65 million dollars was spent in St. Thomas alone by tourists on duty-free items and packaged liquor with the average tourist spending about \$70 per head on these items. Liquor, cigarettes, jewelry and perfume were the major purchases with about ninety per cent of tourists buying liquor. About twenty-five per cent of all duty-free expenditure was on booze, although whether that reflects the incredible value of liquor prices in St. Thomas or simply that St. Thomas tourists are heavy drinkers has not been researched!

When you consider that St. Thomas has a population of only 30,000 people in a 28 square mile area, it is amazing to reflect that in 1981 the island played host to nearly one million tourists—and this did not include the large number of businessmen who visit the island on behalf of companies from all over the world to service the needs of the stores which offer you such a comprehensive range of merchandise.

TRAVELING TO TOWN

But people are beginning to discover that it's not just a shopping port but one of the most beautiful and picturesque islands in the whole of the Caribbean. From the time you enter the narrow channel past the Frenchman's Reef Holiday Inn and into the harbor you will already sense that St. Thomas is something special. Hills rising all around you, a clear blue bay and the brightly painted houses and shops of Charlotte Amalie, the capital, straight ahead.

From the dock, it's a good twenty minutes' walk into town and at this early stage of the day, a taxi is

to be recommended. It is only \$2.00 per person and you'll need all the energy you can muster for the day ahead.

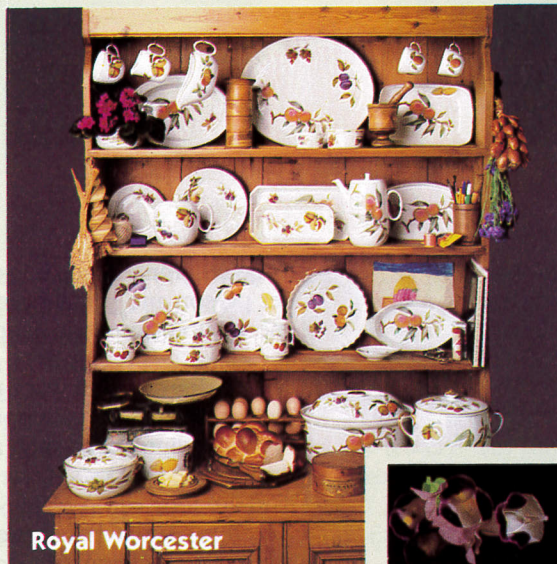
No doubt you'll want to spend at least half the day shopping. Most of the leading shops such as Cardow, Riise, Sparky's, Little Switzerland are located on Main Street which runs adjacent to the Waterfront but you shouldn't stay just on Main Street. There are dozens of little side streets and shopping malls such as Palm Passage, Royal Dane Mall and Drake's Passage to be explored, all with shops offering you what must be the most complete range of merchandise to be found in such a small town in the whole world. You'll also find a liberal smattering of restaurants and bars where you can get lunch or just have a drink.

The number of tourists to St. Thomas has been growing each year by about ten percent.

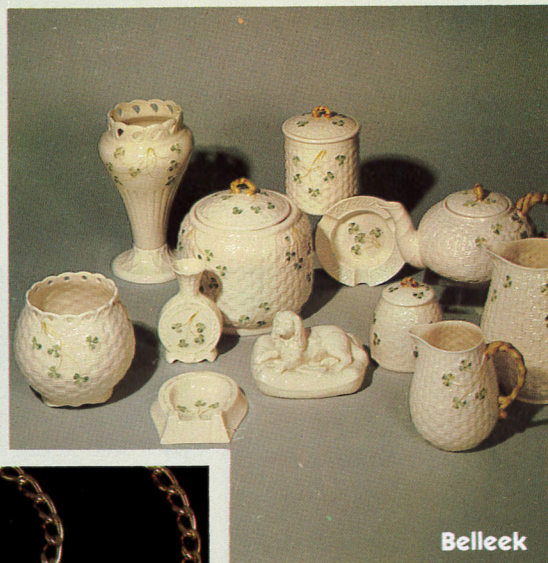
The best way to see the island is to take one of the sightseeing tours which your ship will arrange or which you can do by taxi. On this tour you will normally go to Bluebeard's and then up the hill overlooking Charlotte Amalie and the harbor to Mountain Top where you have a magnificent view of Magens Bay and the dozens of Virgin Islands—both U.S. and British—to the east of St. Thomas. Magens Bay, by the way, has been rated by *National Geographic* as one of the world's six most beautiful beaches—and for good reason. Surrounded by miles of tropical greenery, its powdery, heart-shaped shore is lapped by crystal-clear, turquoise water.

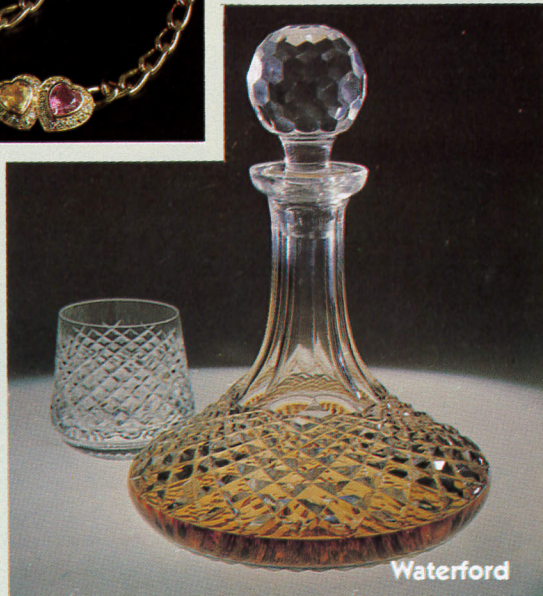

SAN JUAN



Puerto Rico is many things...and many people. You'll find spectacular international cuisine, but you can also discover the intriguing melange of flavors found in native Puerto Rican dishes. You can wander through a rain forest where 100 *billion* gallons of rainwater yearly cause ferns to grow seven feet tall, and microscopic orchids to flourish.

You can linger in boutiques that cater to every imaginable taste and price range, but never have to worry about paying any duty (since Puerto Rico is part of the United States). But you will also have the opportunity to visit native bazaars and enjoy a bounty of local arts and crafts of every description.

And to top it all off, you can toast your foresight and good fortune with a heady Puerto Rican rum, considered by many to be the finest of the Caribbean rums. All in all, you can't lose.

Old San Juan

The district that today we call *Old San Juan* was the personal vision of Juan Ponce de León. He helped plot the layout of the city; he supervised the construction of massive walls, 20-feet thick, to help safeguard it from enemy attack. He decided which structures were to be built and where. And today, nearly 500 years later, we still marvel at the beauty and charm of his city—Old San Juan.

This is the oldest city under the American flag, and except for Santo Domingo in the Dominican Republic, the oldest city in the entire Western hemisphere.

Old San Juan is bounded by two fortresses: *El Morro* and *Fort San Cristóbal*. The rest of the city was surrounded by the wall, much of which still remains.

There are literally dozens of ways to explore Old San Juan, and



you should feel free to try any of them. The area is only seven blocks square, and crammed with half a millennium of history. Still, one of the most energy efficient methods (because you spend most of your time walking downhill instead of up) is to begin at *El Morro*. It's somewhat smaller than Fort San Cristóbal, on the other end of Old San Juan.

El Morro is big, and if you want to wander for yourself, there's no charge for admission. There's also a Children's Museum, and dozens of spooky tunnels to creep through.

About two blocks from El Morro's exit is the *Plaza de San José*. It's a perfect place to begin seeing Old San Juan proper. Facing the Plaza is the *Church of San José*, where the body of Ponce de León was laid from 1559-1908 (he died in Cuba after being wounded in Florida while looking for the elusive Fountain of Youth). The coat of arms

which is displayed above the altar is Ponce's own.

At the other end of Old San Juan, lies *Fort San Cristóbal*. Larger and more modern than El Morro (it was built from 1766 to 1772), the massive structure was 150 feet high, sat on more than 25 acres, and was formed by five independent units that were all interconnected by moats and tunnels.

After you've seen the sights in the heart of Old San Juan, you're on your own: wander the streets, revel in the abundant sense of locale and history, and browse through the unusual gift shops, boutiques and art galleries. Enjoy, but take your time... after all, you've got 500 years of civilization to see!

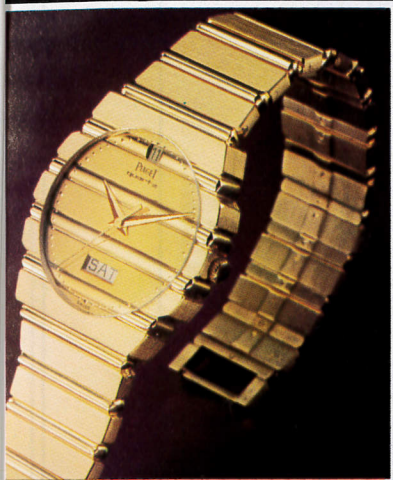

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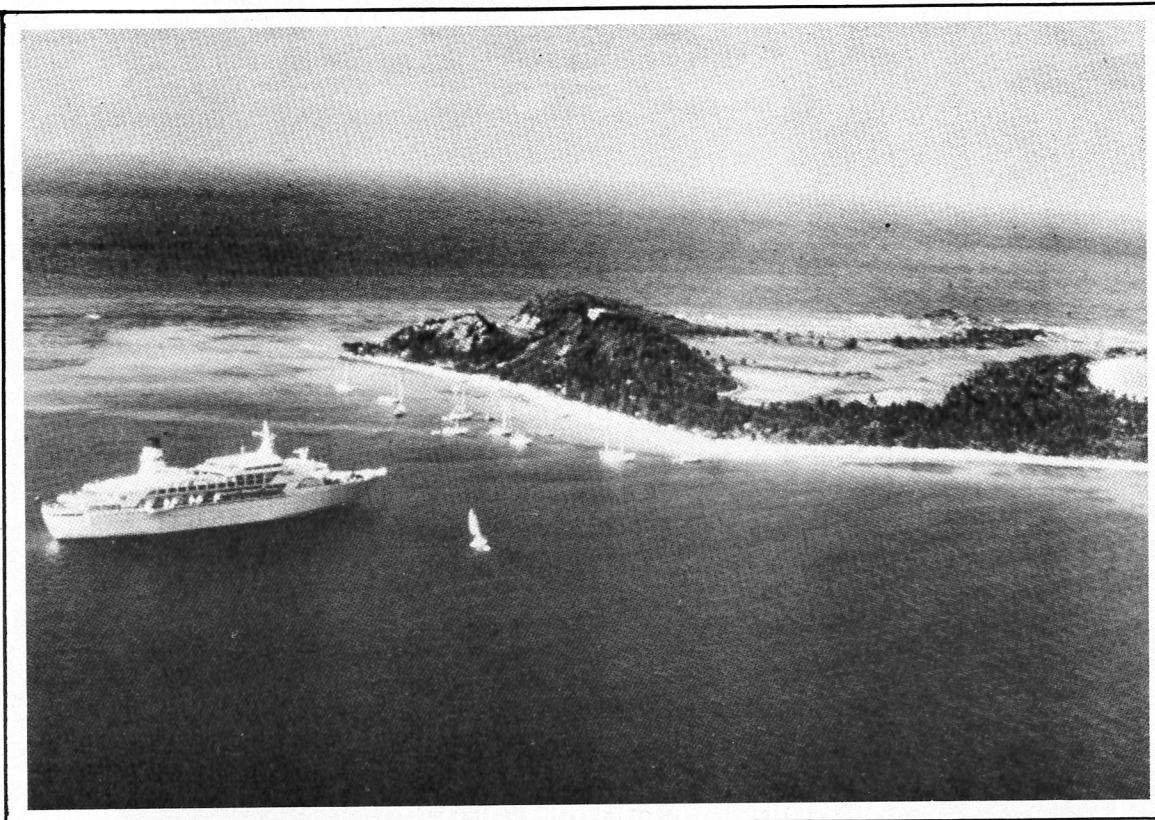
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PALM ISLAND

Although the official name of this tiny spot of land is Prune Island, its less official tag of Palm Island is more romantic...and romance is exactly what Palm Island offers.

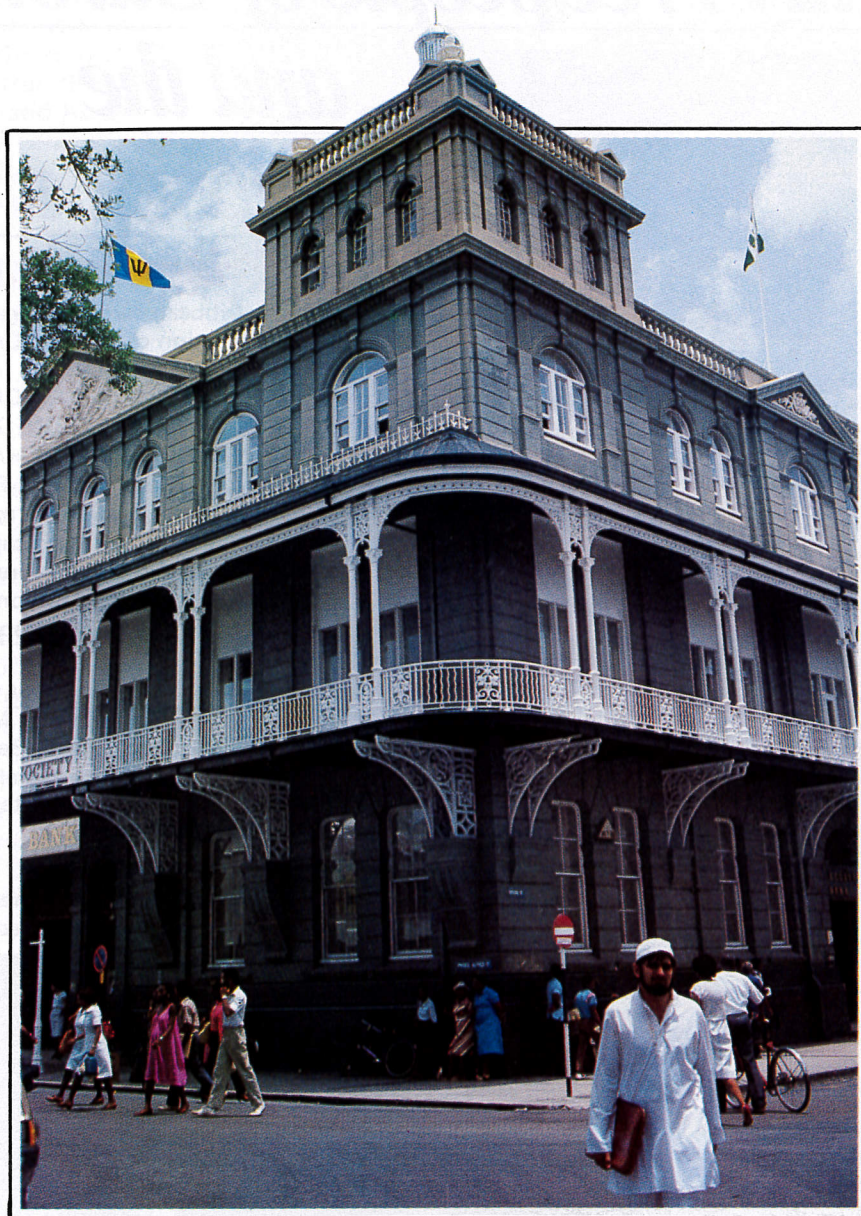
There is its compact size: on only 110 acres, Palm Island offers all the lure of the

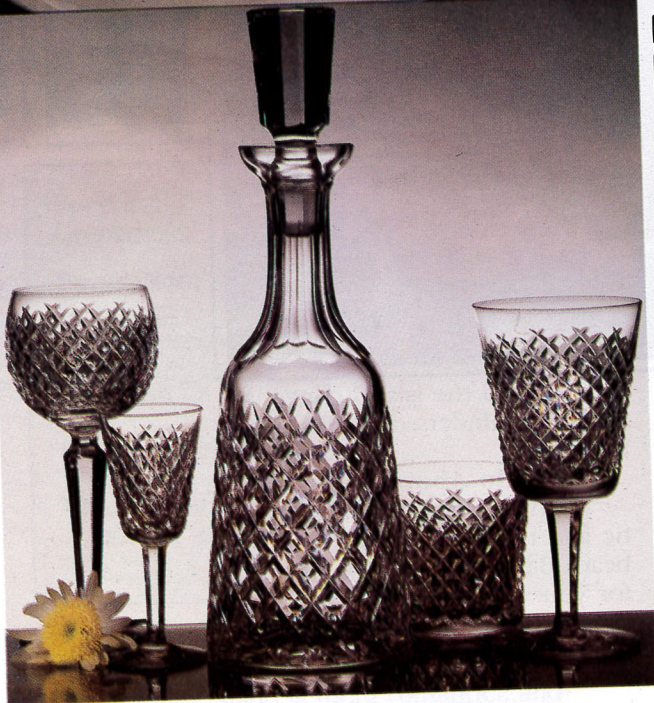

For sheer elegance, spend time at *Sandy Lane*, a short taxi ride from the cruise ship dock. The beach is on the Caribbean side of the island, and delights with warm, quiet water and soft, perfect sand. As for the resort itself, it's one of the true five-star hotels in the tropics, and has a superior air that only comes with true class. There is also the *Sandy Lane Golf Club*, an 18-hole, par 72 course that mixes challenge with scenic splendor. There's even one hole with a 300-foot drop to the green!

If you desire to visit the beaches on your own, the best way is via taxi. (Barbados has an excellent public transit system, but better to be safe than lost!) Check with the Cruise Staff for estimated taxi fares to the spot you desire — the drivers on the island have a well-earned reputation for shrewdness.

Merrie Old Bridgetown

The capital city of the island nation is like a slice of England transported to the tropics. You're very likely to see a Harbour policeman, attired in middie blouse and straw hat — another charming reminder of the island's past.

The easiest way to navigate Bridgetown is on foot, for the streets are all one way — going the wrong way! *Trafalgar Square* contains a statue of Horatio Nelson, which incidentally was erected thirty years before the one in London. Downtown Bridgetown can be dizzyingly busy, with narrow sidewalks and zooming cars. But since the sidewalks serve primarily to connect the stores specializing in duty-free shopping, you probably won't be wandering around much, anyhow. Other locales you may wish to visit include the *Fountain Garden*, the *Public Building, St. Michael's Cathedral* or the *Barbados Museum*.

Seeing The Island

One of the highlights is a visit to *Villa Nova*, a greathouse from the last century. Built in 1834, it served as the center for a sugar plantation owned by a Mr. Edmund Haynes. In the early part of this century, it was sold to the

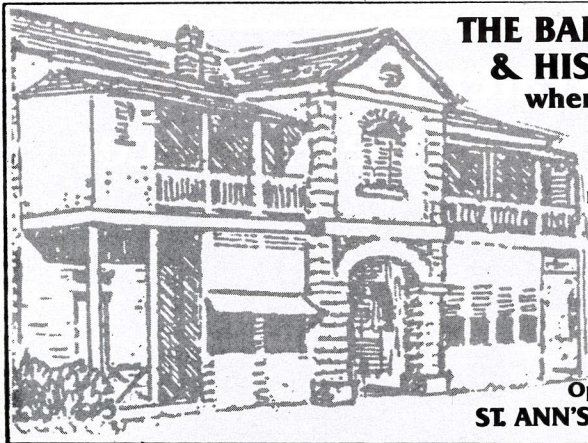

island government, but was purchased in 1965 by Sir Anthony Eden, the former British Prime Minister and eventually bought by the Hunte, who own it today.

Villa Nova is a true delight. Perched on a high hill, the constant breezes and lower temperatures make strolling through the lush tropical garden very enjoyable. Huge Barbados mahogany trees tower over rare tropical fruit trees and brilliant flowers. The house itself has several rooms on display, all filled with antiques and fresh flowers. Occasionally Mrs. Hunte will wander through, to visit with her guests and discuss the house's history — an added treat to a delightful visit.

The official highlight of the tour is the visit to *St. John's Church*, situated about 800 feet above a roiling surf. The small Anglican church that occupies the site was completed in 1836, but it was the third structure to do so, and the cemetery contains tombstones which date 150 years earlier.

Other spots you may wish to see on your own include *Harrison Caves*, near Welchman Hall Gully. Huge limestone formations have been lighted, and you travel along a subterranean path in electric carts. If your interest is in tropical plants, visit *Flower Forest*, at Richmond Plantation or *Welchman's Hall Gully*, where hundreds of examples of exotic plants and trees can be seen. Both are somewhat distant from Bridgetown, but can be reached by taxi. At *Gun Hill*, generations have watched the seas for enemy ships — from the days of Elizabeth I through the end of World War II. The stone lion on guard nearby was carved from a single block of stone.

But whether you want to revel in the past or simply relax in the present, Barbados is certain to be one of the more delightful ports on your cruise!

MARTINIQUE



As the ship approaches Fort-de-France, you can see hundreds of homes scattered along mountainous cliffs, overlooking the sapphire Caribbean. Obviously, Martinique is an island where tropical fantasies can come true.

The heritage here is French, and its influence can still be observed — in the architecture, the lilting Creole patois and the mahogany-skinned residents of this surpassingly beautiful island.

A Royal Heritage

Napoleon's Empress Josephine was born across the bay, and in *La Savane*, the spacious park bordering the water, her statue stands, gazing toward Trois Ilets. Fort-de-France is a bustling commercial center, with French taxis clogging virtually every narrow street.

The town boasts *St. Louis Roman Catholic Church*, built in 1875 of iron, as well as the *Library Schoelcher*, which was

originally designed for the Paris exposition of 1889. Shopping revolves around French fragrances and fashions, plus other duty-free bargains.

Anthuriums to Volcanoes

It's outside of the city, however, that Martinique really shines. The island tour takes you along the circuitous coast, through a series of tiny fishing villages complete with colorful boats and nets drying in the sun. At *St. Pierre*, a small museum commemorates the total destruction of the city by a volcanic explosion in 1902 (the island has two volcanoes). What had been a town of 40,000 souls was wiped out in a morning — there was only one survivor.

From *St. Pierre*, the tour takes you along twisting roads up into the mountains. The scenery is nothing short of spectacular, as you glimpse vistas of tropical banana and anthurium plantations rolling down the rugged cliffs toward the sea. Depending on the

season, you can find roadside stands selling the unique flowers in several colors. Sparkling fresh streams tumble along and the temperature drops 10 degrees or more, making the trip an absolute delight.

An alternative excursion carries you on a raft tour to a quiet beach, where you can sun, stroll, explore the natural reef or swim. Then it's on to some famous (and topless) resorts for a beach party and finally back to the ship. If you'd like to relax on your own, there are several lovely beaches across the bay, and the ferry runs regularly. Duffers will enjoy the challenge of the *Empress Josephine Golf Course*, an 18-hole, par 71 course that pits your skill against hilly terrain and constant trade winds.

CURACAO

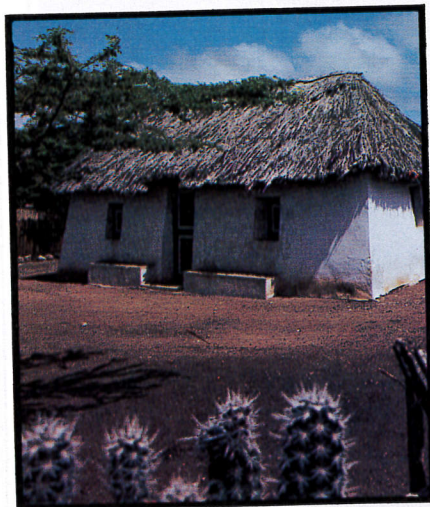


If you were to arrive in Willemstad via H.G. Wells' time machine, your first impression would be that the unpredictable device had landed you in 17th-century Amsterdam. As you'll see, Willemstad appears the quintessential Old World Dutch city, complete with gable-roofed buildings neatly painted in gay, pastel colors. Street musicians and ice cream vendors strolling along the city's outdoor malls add to its charm, as do its cobblestone roads and friendly, outgoing people. (Among the first words you'll probably hear are *bon bini*, which means *welcome* in Papiamentu.)

Curacaoans are extremely proud of Willemstad's "Hans Christian Andersen story book" appearance. So proud, they're in the midst of an extensive on-going program designed to maintain and restore the traditional ambience of various places of his-

torical interest and the fresh-scrubbed peacefulness that's been a trademark of Curacao ever since Peter Stuyvesant, the Dutchman who negotiated the purchase of Manhattan for about \$24 in trinkets, was the island's first governor.

One especially interesting historical attraction that's been well-maintained is the *Mikve Israel Synagogue*, the oldest Jewish house of worship in the western hemisphere. Built in 1732, the Temple's floor is



covered with fine white sand to remind worshippers of the desert where the children of Israel camped— and because it muffles the sound of footsteps on the hollow wooden plank floor. Other places of interest in Willemstad include the city's *floating market*, where sailboats laden with fresh fruits and vegetables from nearby Venezuela pull up to conduct business, and *Fort Amsterdam*, the center of a complex of 18th-century buildings that now serve as the Curacaoan seat of government and which includes the *Governor's Palace*.

Queens Emma and Juliana

Although Curacaoans have been successful in their program to maintain and restore Willemstad's architectural and cultural ties with its past, the city is far from staid. In fact, it's a lively, fairly contemporary community.

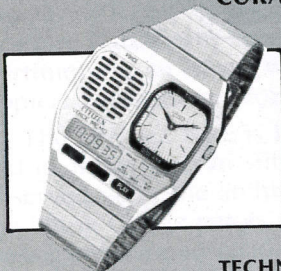
Named after William II, King of Holland during the early years of Dutch settlement, Willemstad is the capital of both Curacao and of the Netherlands Antilles.

As the ship enters the harbor you should make a point of being

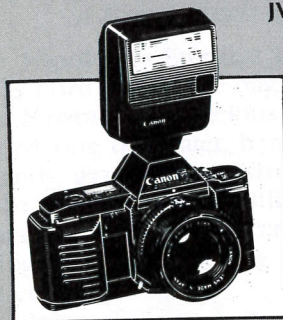
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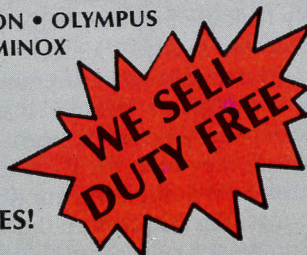

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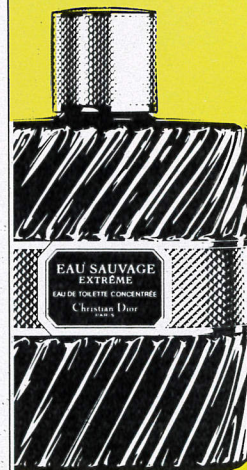

on deck, for it's from here that you'll enjoy what many consider to be the most interesting view of the city. You sail right through the narrow channel which separates the two districts of the city, *Punda* and *Otrabanda*. Punda is on the right, with the massive Curacao Plaza Hotel guarding the harbor entrance. Next you'll see the famous *Penha* building, built in 1708, which stands at the head of the city's two main shopping streets, Breedestraat and Heerenstraat.

Spanning the channel you'll see two very different yet equally remarkable bridges. One, called the *Queen Emma*, is a floating pontoon bridge built in 1888 and modernized in 1939. Situated at the entrance to the harbor, the Queen Emma will swivel open to the Otrabanda side twenty to thirty times a day to admit about 6,500 ships a year, including yours.

The other bridge, the *Queen Juliana*, is one of the highest in the world and was dedicated in 1974. Built so the Queen Emma could remain open to pedestrians for longer periods, the majestic, 195-foot high Queen Juliana dominates the skyline

of Willemstad, the world's fifth busiest harbor and an intersection of international trade.

That Willemstad is a crossroads of commerce is evident in the scope and quality of its shopping environment. A picturesque pedestrian mall, and low, freeport prices make shopping convenient and worthwhile.

Many of the city's finest stores are on Breedestraat and Heerenstraat streets; the latter, decorated with pink tiles, is closed to traffic. The shops that line these and other streets in Punda carry imported items from around the world, many at prices far lower than you'll find on identical merchandise in the United States.

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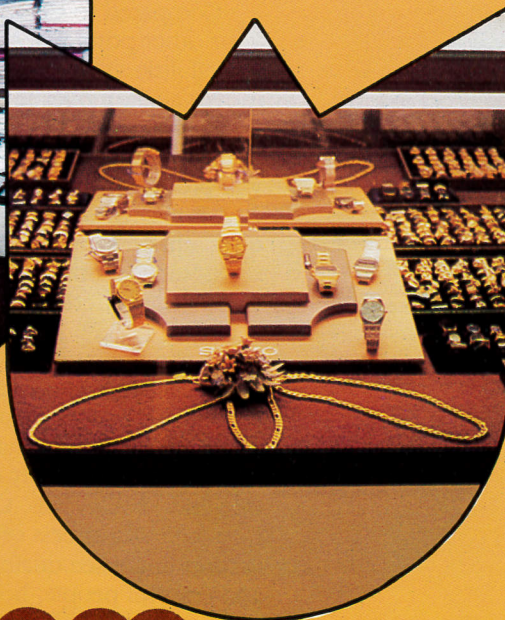
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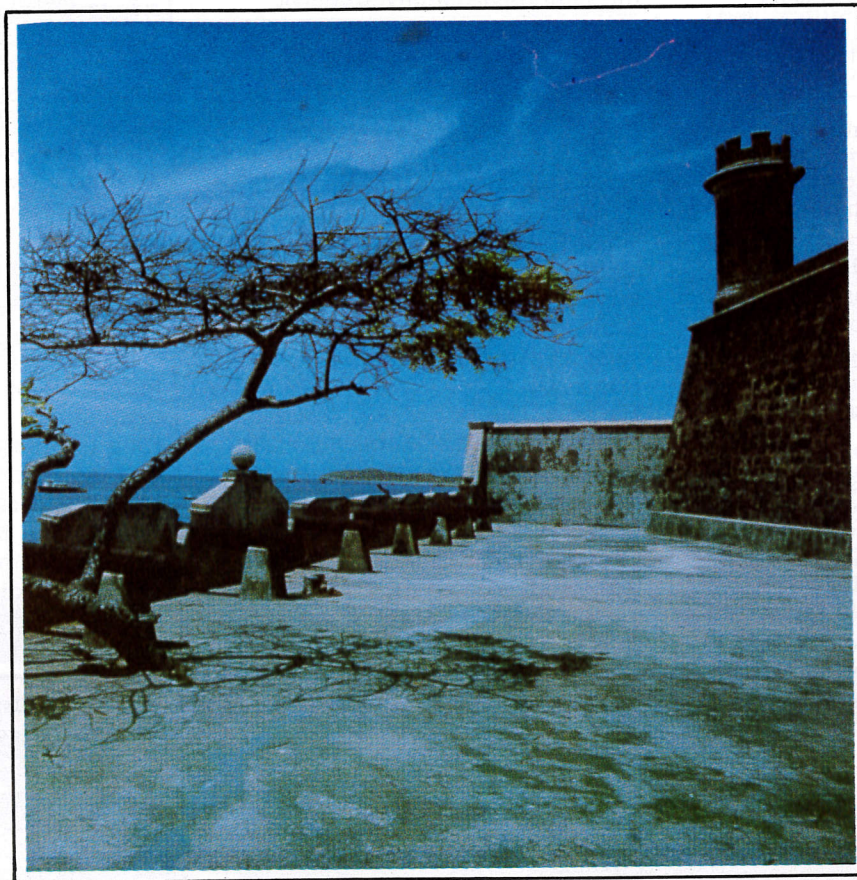


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CARACAS



Compared to Caracas, most of your other ports will seem like provincial little villages where time, if it moves at all, moves in slow motion.

As you approach the outskirts of Caracas, traffic along the highway will probably thicken. Entering the city, it may even thicken more. If it does, chances are you'll be too busy sightseeing to notice it, for Caracas rarely stops offering an interesting eyeful.

In the new section of the city you'll see stunning examples of modern architecture, ultra-chic boutiques, and fashionably dressed people walking briskly down broad, tree-lined boulevards. On the narrow, winding streets of the city's old section you'll see quaint buildings and colorful people, both possessing a delightful Spanish personality.

If the prospect of visiting a large,

bustling city doesn't particularly appeal to you, an excellent alternative is to visit Macuto Beach. Located only 10 minutes by taxi from La Guaira, Macuto is world-famous for its magnificent backdrop of mountains and palm trees, its pounding surf, and for being the back yard of some of the finest hotels in South America. By the way, you *may* wear shorts and halter tops if you visit the beach.

If neither the city nor the beach sound inviting, don't despair. You can hire a taxi and take the sensational drive up Mount Avila. Located just north of Caracas, this 7,500-foot mountain covered by dense foliage and huge rock formations offers increasingly spectacular views of the city and the valley below as you climb its winding, often narrow roads.



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
